

First World War Roll of Honour of National Bank of Scotland


National Bank of Scotland was established in Edinburgh in 1825. By the outbreak of war in 1914 it had 175 branches across Scotland and one in London.

In the course of the war 436 National Bank men served in uniform, of whom 78 were killed. This book was published in the 1920s to honour them. It begins with an account of the unveiling of the bank's war memorial in 1921, followed by a photograph of the memorial. Pages v-vii record the names of the 78 men who died. The main part of the book, beginning at page 1, lists all 436 men who served in alphabetical order, with the bank branch they went from; their regiment; final rank; and, where applicable, details of decorations, wounds and death. Finally, page 51 summarises the medals and decorations awarded to members of the bank's staff.

National Bank of Scotland's war memorial was originally installed in the lobby of its head office at 42 St Andrew Square, Edinburgh. That building was rebuilt in the 1940s, and only the central panel of the memorial, bearing the names of the Fallen, was transferred to the new building. It was later remade with small alterations to match a memorial commemorating the Fallen of the Second World War.

In 1959 National Bank of Scotland merged with Commercial Bank of Scotland to form National Commercial Bank of Scotland. A decade later, that bank became part of the Royal Bank of Scotland.

In 2005 the Royal Bank of Scotland moved from 42 St Andrew Square to new headquarters at Gogarburn, on the western edge of Edinburgh. The building's war memorials were removed and reinstalled at Gogarburn. They were rededicated at their new location on 30 June 2006, in a ceremony attended by current bank staff and descendants of men named on the memorials.

THE Memorial Tablet is erected in the vestibule of the Head Office, and will be a lasting tribute to the memory of the members of the Bank's Staff who laid down their lives for their country's freedom, and whose loss is mourned not only by the relatives but by their colleagues.

The Tablet was unveiled by The Governor of the Bank, HIS GRACE THE DUKE OF MONTROSE, K.T., on 22nd December 1921, in presence of the Deputy Governor and Directors, and a large gathering of relatives and friends of those whose names are recorded on the Tablet, and many members of the present Staff.

The CHAIRMAN of the Board of Directors introduced His Grace, who said :

“ I have the honour to unveil this Memorial to the 78 Members of the Staff of The National Bank of Scotland who, at the call of King and Country, left all that was dear to them, endured hardship, faced danger, and then finally passed out of sight of men by the path of duty, giving up their own lives that others might live in freedom.

“ When the burden of War first bore heavily upon the Country, the response to the call of duty from every profession was nobly made, and without counting the cost and with no idea of self-interest, the flower of our manhood gave up all that they had for their Country's cause. They won the Victory and the Victor's Crown.

“ Only those who have seen the devastated regions of France and Belgium can fully realise from what horrors these brave men saved their Country. They fought with grim determination, as Lord Haig said, with their backs to the wall, and their gallant deeds will be recorded for all time in the Annals of the British Army.

“ I should like to quote a sentence from an address delivered by General Currie, commanding the Canadian troops, on the eve of one of the great advances in 1917. I think this quotation conveys a word of comfort to those who have been bereaved of their dear ones. General Currie said : ‘ To those about to fall, I say you will not die, but enter into immortality ; your mothers will have been proud to have borne such sons. You will be revered for ever and ever by a grateful Country, and God Almighty will take you into His keeping.’

“ Any observations I have been privileged to make to-day must in the natural course of events shortly be forgotten, but this Memorial will remain in perpetuity as a record of the brave and self-sacrificing service given to their Country during the Great War by 78 Members of the Staff of The National Bank of Scotland. We have need of such men in Britain to-day.”

The Memorial was thereafter dedicated by the Right Rev. A. WALLACE WILLIAMSON, D.D.
